


PHF Broadens Range of Programs to Support Pennsylvania History

At the recent virtual meeting of the Pennsylvania Historical & Museum Commission in June, the Pennsylvania Heritage Foundation board announced a number of measures to expand its support of Pennsylvania history programs as the COVID-19 crisis continues.

For membership, PHF has worked to increase the function and content of its website. An online membership portal has been launched to provide a go-to for information on special membership programs and PHF projects and campaigns. The portal shares online resources of PHMC and includes a database for important documents that relate to the history of Pennsylvania, information to help members plan trips to the Trails of History sites and surrounding attractions and amenities, a who's who of Pennsylvania history, and a page with activities and fun facts for family members of all ages. PHF has also initiated an email newsletter on Trails of History programs and events and fascinating narratives from across the commonwealth.

Recently PHF began a partnership with PHMC to assist in the administration of a site manager at the Daniel Boone Homestead, one of PHMC's Trails of History sites, in

Birdsboro, Berks County. Heather Hicks was hired in February as the new site manager and is preparing the site to reopen when the time comes. PHF also now partners with The State Museum of Pennsylvania in presenting *Art of the State*.

In fundraising, efforts have continued for the Scholars in Residence Program for the Pennsylvania State Archives (see PHF Newsletter, Summer 2020) and a special fund to bring schoolchildren to the Pennsylvania Trails of History sites and museums.

PHF will partner with the Pennsylvania State Archives for grants through the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC) and will be responsible to submit required paperwork and financial reports.

In addition to administering selected program funds for PHMC, including *Art of the State* and the Training in Preservation Series, PHF manages funds for the Pennsylvania Commission for the United States Semiquincentennial (America250PA), established by the legislature and governor to plan, encourage, develop and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States.

The Pennsylvania Heritage Foundation is pleased to announce that C. James Holliman and John F. MacDonald have recently joined its Board of Directors.

C. James “Jim” Holliman, M.D., has had a career centered around the development of the specialty of emergency medicine and training programs internationally and in providing combat medicine and mass casualty management training for the U.S. military. The Pennsylvania Commission for the United States Semiquincentennial (America250PA) will be appointing nonvoting Advisory Committee Members at its Fall 2020 meeting. A call for applications for the committee was made through social media over the summer. The America250PA commission seeks to ensure diversity and geographical balance among the active participants. Each of Pennsylvania's 67 counties will have one representative to the County Advisory Committee. Members will be appointed to the following subcommittees: Fundraising, Marketing, Education/Innovation, Historical, Arts and Culture, Veterans, Diversity and Inclusion, Military, and Women.

America250PA was established by the legislature and governor in 2018 to plan, encourage, develop and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States. The Pennsylvania Heritage Foundation serves as America250PA's nonprofit partner, responsible for collecting donations, follow-up and reporting.

The goals of America250PA are expressed as E.P.I.C.: Educate, Preserve, Innovate and



Celebrate. The commission seeks to highlight history so Pennsylvanians can better understand the origins and multiple perspectives of issues facing the nation and commonwealth today; to celebrate the contributions of Pennsylvanians to the nation's and the commonwealth's history; to encourage and inspire future leaders; and to leave a lasting impact on the next generation and ignite the drive for them to appreciate the triumphs, trials and tribulations that contributed to the nation today.


